ARCHIVES TITLES	
ACA Bulletin	The <i>ACA Bulletin</i> is the Association of Canadian Archivists' newsletter which keeps members informed of ACA activities, archival developments, conferences, workshops, publications and other topics of interest to archivists.
African Journal of Library, Archives and Information Science	Reports research findings on empirical investigations and highly theoretical studies on library and archives management, publishing, and information science.
American Archivist	The <i>American Archivist</i> is the semi-annual journal of the Society of American Archivists. It seeks to reflect thinking about theoretical and practical developments in the archival profession, particularly in North America; about the relationships between archivists and the creators and users of archives; and about cultural, social, legal, and technological developments that affect the nature of recorded information and the need to create and maintain it.
Arbido	In German, French and Italian. A journal of the Swiss Archivists Association. Covers association news, information and reports. Includes budgets, reports and lists of events, and positions available. This is a merger of <i>Arbido-A</i> and <i>Arbido-B</i>
Archifacts	Archifacts is the journal of the Archives and Records Association of New Zealand and is published twice-yearly. It includes book reviews and articles on all aspects of archives and records management including collections, preservation, and their use and effective administration.
Archival Issues (continues Midwestern Archivist)	<i>Archival Issues</i> publishes a wide range of articles "concerned with the issues and problems confronting the contemporary archivist." Although it is published by a regional archival association, there is nothing really regional in its focus, and it continues to be an important outlet for consistently interesting articles. Recent topics covered include archival education, appraisal of sound recordings, and the use of volunteers in archival repositories.
Archival Outlook	<i>Archival Outlook</i> updates members on important business of the Society of American Archivists and on the work of its many committees, sections, boards, and task forces; and reports regional, national, and international news of relevance to the North American archival profession. Regular columns include "Bulletin Board" (a running calendar of meetings, workshops, seminars, funding, call for papers); "Currents" (members' position appointments, professional achievements and honors); "Professional Opportunities" (job announcements); "Illuminations" (how-to information); as well as lengthier features.
Archival Science	<i>Archival Science</i> aims at promoting the development of archival science as an autonomous scientific discipline, targeting primarily on researchers and educators in archival science, and secondarily on everyone else who is professionally interested in recorded information. The journal's approach is integrated, interdisciplinary and intercultural: it covers the whole records continuum; it associates with the scientific disciplines dealing with (1) the function of records and the way they are created, preserved

	and retrieved, (2) the context in which information is generated, managed and used and (3) the social and cultural environment of records creation in different times and places; and it acknowledges the impact of different cultures on archival theory, methodology and practice.
Archivaria	The <i>Journal of the Association of Canadian Archivists</i> (ACA), is devoted to the scholarly investigation of archives in Canada and internationally. Articles explore the history, nature, and theory of archives and the use of archives. The journal aims to be a bridge of communication among archivists, and between archivists and users of archives. The various issues serve well to indicate the breadth of possible subjects relating to archives: various media and their evolution and characteristics; theoretical problems; practical solutions; new fields of history (and related disciplines), and new kinds of documentation being explored by users; new technological developments; legal and ethical concerns; the history of archives, individual archivists, and archival trends; the analysis of record-keeping practices over time and space; the relationship of archivists to other information management professionals; and much else.
Archives	The Journal of the British Records Association, <i>Archives</i> primarily features research articles on historical records in Britain viewed from the standpoint of the user of these records as opposed to the viewpoint of the archival custodian of such records. Even the extensive book review section tends to focus on works of history or guides to archival records. "Report and Comment" is a regular feature that includes short reports on specific collections or, occasionally, on issues of archival management. Even more wide-ranging is "Other Works Received," which offers brief comments on books, periodicals, archival guides, and reports.
Archives and Manuscripts	<i>Archives and Manuscripts</i> is the Australian archival profession's journal. Published since 1955 the journal provides archivists and other recordkeeping and information professionals with up to date material on professional issues and practice.
Archives and Museum Informatics	Carries news, opinion and reports on information technologies, techniques and theories relevant to archives and museums.
The Archivist	In English and French, <i>The Archivist</i> is a free, information-packed magazine highlighting the archival resources and services of the National Archives of Canada.
Archivum	A scholarly journal published by the International Council on Archives. Reports on the council's proceedings, and often presents theme issues of international importance in the field of archives. Articles are presented in English, French, Spanish, Russian, and German.
Bulletin: Association of Canadian Map and Librarians Archives	<i>The Bulletin</i> , published three times per year, is the official journal of ACMLA. It includes quality articles on current issues concerning cartographic information, as well as reviews and information on the activities of the Association and its members. In English and French.
Bulletin/Australian Society of Archivists	Contains short articles: minutes of council meeting, announces other meetings, seminars, and gives short synopses of what was said during meetings and lectures, calendar of events.
Journal of Archival Organization	<i>The Journal of Archival Organization</i> is an international journal encompassing all aspects of the arrangement, description, and provision of access to all forms

	of archival materials. Articles on processing techniques and procedures, preparation of finding aids, and cataloging of archival and manuscript collections in accordance with MARC, AACR2, and other rules, standards, and cataloging conventions are only part of what you'll find in this refereed/peer-reviewed publication. The journal delivers reviews of publications and archival Web sites as well as important news within the field, covering formats including: manuscripts, printed documents, microforms, photographs and other images, oral history tapes and transcripts, electronic records, cartographic materials, architectural drawings, and new and developing electronic formats.
Journal of the Society of Archivists	Articles of interest to archivists, conservators, records managers and those involved in historical disciplines relaying information on training opportunities, developments in administration techniques, conservation and records management.
Maine Archives & Museum Newsletter	Provides information of Funding Opportunities; Books and Publications; Statewide Museum; Historical Society, Archives News and Activities; Shared Resources; All-Volunteer Organizations; Ideas that Work in Maine; Computers; Conservation; Technical Questions; Ethical Matters.
Mid-Atlantic Archivist	The quarterly newsletter of the Mid-Atlantic Regional Archives Conference (MARAC)
Midwestern Archivist	see <i>Archival Issues</i>
NEA (New England Archivists) Newsletter	News from archives in New England, about NEA members, and about upcoming events. Includes reviews, long articles, and session reports for NEA meetings.
News From the Archives	A quarterly compilation by the National Archives and Records Administration. Includes short articles, grants and awards, accessions and openings, publications, declassifications, and National Archives Directory.
Practical Archivist	An Australian publication containing short articles.
Provenance (continues Georgia Archives)	The journal's primary focus concerns the archival profession in the theory and practice of archival management. Recent issues have included such topics as archival education; electronic records; automation; imaging; appraisal of university records; moving archives; management of audiovisual, photograph, oral history, and map materials; military archives; documentary editing; research use of archives; case studies in appraising congressional papers; ethics; and descriptive standards.
The Record: news from the National Archives and Records Administration	See <i>News from the Archives</i> above
Restaurator	<i>Restaurator</i> is the only international periodical specializing exclusively in the conservation of library and archive materials. Articles from all parts of the world examine the many important aspects of this subject area, such as technology, practical experience and organization. All articles bear the hallmark of academic authority: the majority deal with the development of new methods and the improvement and improved understanding of existing ones. The editorial committee is made up of experts from well-known institutions and organizations. By reading <i>Restaurator</i> regularly, librarians, archivists and restorers can keep up to date with the latest research and developments. The

	articles are written in English with summaries in English, French and German.

<i>Information Management Journal</i> , (continues <i>Records Management Quarterly</i>)	<i>The Information Management Journal</i> strives to be the leading source of information on topics and issues central to the management of records and information worldwide. Its goal is to advance the records and information management field's knowledge base and help satisfy the ever-changing educational needs of information management professionals worldwide. It is published bi-monthly by ARMA International, the authority on managing records and information in all formats. ARMA is the only not-for-profit professional association committed to promoting the importance and value of records and information management in enterprises of all sizes and in all industries.
<i>Crossroads NAGARA</i>	Provides NAGARA members and interested collaborators with access to breaking news about developments in information policy, the management of electronic records, and citations to Web sites or recent publications or articles covering these subjects. The newsletter is published at quarterly intervals between the issuance of the NAGARA newsletter, Clearinghouse.
<i>E-doc</i> , (continues <i>Inform</i>)	<i>AIIM E-DOC Magazine</i> is an industry source for information on enterprise content management (ECM) topics that help management professionals worldwide make informed and effective technology decisions. Published six (6) times a year by AIIM International, <i>AIIM E-DOC Magazine</i> is written by technology experts and executives. Each issue includes insightful feature stories, targeted case studies, lessons learned, and problems solved.
<i>Records & Information Management Report</i>	<i>Records & Information Management Report</i> provides in-depth discussions of topics vital to professional information managers. Each issue focuses on a particular subject, and includes an overview of the topic, a summary of the latest research, suggestions for practical application, and a list of resources.
<i>Records Management Journal</i>	<i>Records Management Journal</i> publishes research results, case studies and critical comment of value to records professionals and educators, as well as students developing an understanding of the discipline of records, information and archives management.
