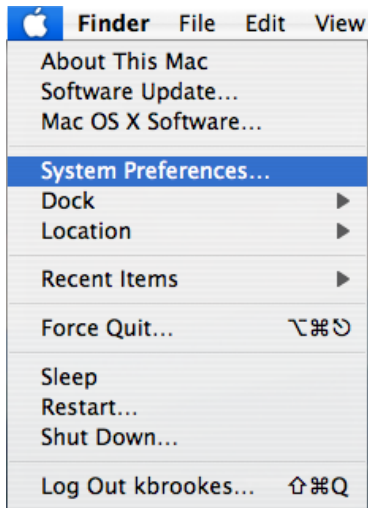

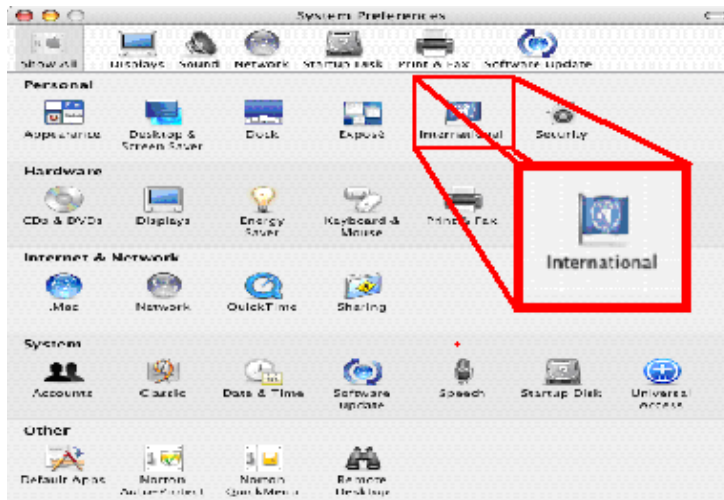
Mac OS X: How to Display and Use the On-Screen Keyboard

Use **On-Screen Keyboard** to display a mouse-operated virtual keyboard on your screen.

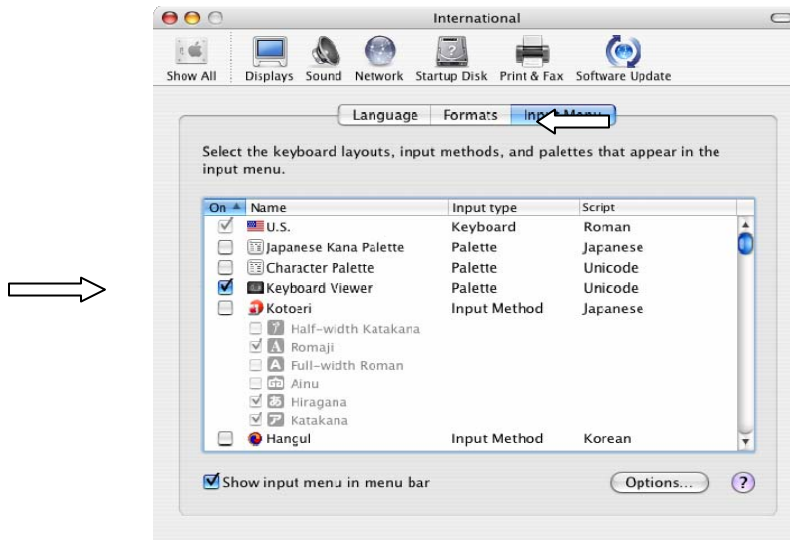
1. From the Apple menu, located at the top of the screen, click **System Preferences**.



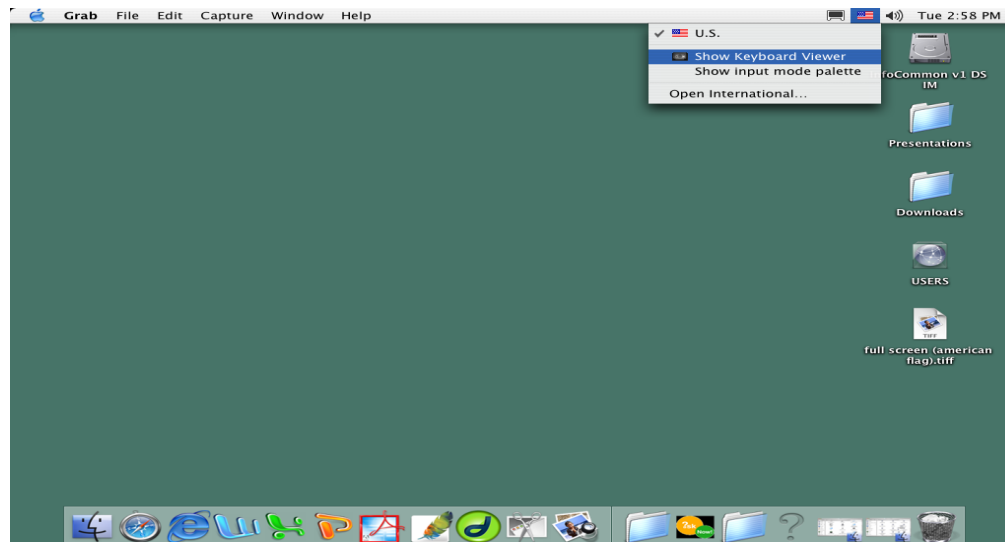
2. Click **International**.



3. In the International system preference, go to the **Input Menu** tab, check **Keyboard Viewer**. Then close the International system preference by clicking the red circle at the top left of the system preference.



4. There is a new menu on the top right corner of your computer screen. Click the **U.S. menu** (with the American flag next to it), and select **Show Keyboard Viewer**.



5. The Onscreen Keyboard will appear on the desktop.



If the Onscreen Keyboard is too small, click on the green plus (+) sign, located in the upper left hand corner of the menu bar, to expand.

Open the document you would like to modify or create. Using your mouse pointer, start typing on the Keyboard Viewer and it will appear on the open document. When you are finished, close the keyboard viewer, by clicking the red X located upper left on the menu bar, and it will disappear.
